

TOUGHER PENALTIES FOR REPEAT D.U.I. OFFENDERS

In 2002, Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh and former State Senator Leigh Herington drafted legislation to toughen the laws against repeat drunk drivers.

On June 24, 2004, Ohio Gov. Taft signed this legislation into law, increasing the penalties and jail time for repeat offenders who drive while intoxicated.

DUI offenders with five or more DUI's in 20 years must now serve a mandatory one-to-five-year prison term.
